COMMISSIONER'S ORDER GRANTING PETITIONER'S MOTION TO DISMISS

On July 3, 2008, Tung Chan, Commissioner of Securities, Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs, State of Hawaii, ("Commissioner") issued a Preliminary Order to Cease and Desist and Notice of Right to Hearing ("Preliminary Order") against JAIC Retirement Services, Inc. and Andrew O. Steger ("Respondents").

- Respondents were served with the Preliminary Order by personal service on September 19, 2008.
- 2. The Office of Administrative Hearings received Respondents' Request for Hearing on Preliminary Order to Cease and Desist on October 22, 2008. The matter was set for hearing and the notice of hearing and pre-hearing conference was transmitted to the parties.
- 3. On October 27, 2008, the Securities Enforcement Branch, Business Registration Division, Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs ("Petitioner") by and through its attorney Dean A. Soma, Esq. filed a Motion for Order Dismissing Respondents' Request for Hearing ("Motion"). A hearing on the Motion was scheduled for November 5, 2008.

A pre-hearing conference was held on October 31, 2008 and attended by Mr.

Soma on behalf of Petitioner and Conswella Edwards, Esq. on behalf of Respondents. The

parties agreed to postpone the hearing on the Motion from November 5, 2008 to December

1, 2008 and the hearing on the merits from November 13, 2008 to December 17, 2008. A

Pre-Hearing Order was issued on November 3, 2008.

On December 1, 2008, the hearing on the Motion was convened by Hearings

Officer, Sheryl Lee A. Nagata. Petitioner was represented by Mr. Soma. Respondents failed

to enter an appearance either in person or through counsel. The matter was then taken

under advisement.

6. Hawai'i Revised Statutes § 485-18.7(b) provides that upon notification of the

issuance of an order to cease and desist, the matter will be set for a hearing upon receipt of

a written request made within thirty days. In this matter, Respondents were served with the

Preliminary Order on September 19, 2008, so Respondents' request for hearing had to be

received on October 20, 2008.1 Because Respondents' request for hearing was received on

October 22, 2008, the Commissioner finds that Respondents' request for hearing was not

timely.

Accordingly, the Commissioner GRANTS Petitioner's Motion and the Final Order

issued on October 23, 2008, is AFFIRMED in all respects.

HEARINGS OFFICER'S RECOMMENDED ORDER GRANTING PETITIONER'S MOTION TO DISMISS

On July 3, 2008, the Commissioner of Securities, Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs, ("Commissioner") issued a Preliminary Order to Cease and Desist and Notice of Right to Hearing ("Preliminary Order") against JAIC Retirement Services, Inc. and Andrew O. Steger ("Respondents"). Respondents were served with the Preliminary Order by personal service on September 19, 2008.

The Office of Administrative Hearings received Respondents' Request for Hearing on Preliminary Order to Cease and Desist on October 22, 2008. The matter was set for hearing and the notice of hearing and pre-hearing conference was transmitted to the parties.

On October 27, 2008, the Securities Enforcement Branch, Business Registration Division, Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs ("Petitioner") by and throught its attorney Dean A. Soma, Esq. filed a Motion for Order Dismissing Respondents' Request for Hearing ("Motion"). A hearing on the Motion was scheduled for November 5, 2008.

At the pre-hearing conference on October 31, 2008 and attended by Mr. Soma on behalf of Petitioner and Conswella Edwards, Esq. on behalf of Respondents, the parties agreed to postpone the hearing on the Motion from November 5, 2008 to December 1, 2008 and the

hearing on the merits from November 13, 2008 to December 17, 2008. A Pre-Hearing Order was issued on November 3, 2008.

On December 1, 2008, the hearing on the Motion was convened by the undersigned Hearings Officer. Petitioner was represented by Mr. Soma. Respondents failed to enter an appearance either in person or through counsel. The matter was taken under advisement.

Hawai'i Revised Statutes § 485-18.7(b) provides that upon notification of the issuance of an order to cease and desist, the matter will be set for a hearing upon receipt of a written request made within thirty days. In the case at bar, Respondents were served with the Preliminary Order on September 19, 2008, so Respondents' request for hearing had to be received by October 20, 2008.¹ Because Respondents' request for hearing was received on October 22, 2008, the Hearings Officer finds that Respondents' request for hearing was not timely and concludes that Petitioner's Motion should be granted.

Accordingly, the Hearings Officer recommends that the Commissioner grant Petitioner's Motion and affirm the July 3, 2008 Preliminary Order.
